The Buffalo Zoo in 2016 can be summed up in four words the Pride of Buffalo. Not only did we celebrate the first lion cubs born in Buffalo in 25 years, but the Zoo attracted a record 538,100 visitors. This led to a terrific bottom line with admissions revenue up 25% and food service up 19% from the previous year. We took great pride in receiving accreditation for another five years from the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) for the eighth consecutive time. During our site inspection, the Visiting Committee was very complimentary about the Zoo's new exhibits, graphics, conservation and education programs, and our overall cleanliness and appearance. Other notable achievements in 2016 included a Brick by Brick award from Business First for Best Green Construction for the Arctic Edge exhibit and a Regional Asset Award from the Amherst Chamber of Commerce. We were also honored to host the Otter Keeper Workshop in October, bringing in 80 participants from around the country to focus on otter husbandry and conservation.

RESEARCH PROJECTS SUPPORTED IN 2016

The Zoological Society of Buffalo recognizes that important contributions are made to the Zoo and to the profession by research efforts. The Society also recognizes that research benefits society at large by contributing to our collective knowledge of nature. Listed here are the research projects conducted or contributed to as a result of Committee approval and/or cooperation with AZA requests in 2016, and those projects continued from previous years.

African Lion

Ben Norton

Smithsonian Institution

This study collected information for a morbidity and mortality report of lions housed in North America from 2001 - 2016.

Asian Elephant

International Elephant Foundation AZA Elephant SSP AZA Conservation Endowment Fund

This project was a study to reduce elephant deaths caused by Endotheliotropic Elephant Herpes Virus (EEHV). Historic data and blood samples provided to determine prevalence of EEHV in collection animals. Sample submission continued in 2016.

Asian One-Horned Rhino

Agnes Bodo

Budapest Zoo and Botanical Garden

The researcher is a Masters candidate, focusing on what zoos can do to save this rhino species, based on Al projects in Budapest Zoo. Involvement in this project was the completion of a survey on rhinoceros husbandry.

Laura Harrington, PhD Robin Radcliffe, DVM Cornell University

Researchers are developing a multiplex PCR to detect rhinoceros blood, banteng blood and buffalo blood in tabanid fly samples from Indonesia.

Jesse Woitusik Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Gardens

Develop a ferritin assay for iron overlad disorder in rhinoceros.

Monica Stoops, PhD Cincinnati Zoo- CRES

Samples submitted for the determination of estrus cycles in captive Asian one-horned rhinos. The accurate determination of estrus is used to time natural and artificial breeding attempts. Sample submission continued in 2016.

Samples submitted and ultrasound performed to develop novel ultrasound and urinary endocrine measures to improve AI timing and help predict ovulation outcomes in the Indian rhinoceros.

Black Howler Monkey

University of Wisconsin, Madison

Samples collected to attempt to validate the use of urinary C-peptide (UCP) as a noninvasive proxy for insulin production in howler monkeys.

Nancy Carpenter Utah's Hougle Zoo

Survey completed on the morbidity and mortality of black howler monkeys.

Eastern Hellbender

In partnership with NYSDEC, Cornell University, and the Eastern hellbender working group, the Buffalo Zoo continued efforts to study the effectiveness of hatching and releasing hellbenders. 2016 efforts **Q** focused on investigating chytridiomycosis inoculation prior to release of adult animals.











Eastern Massasaugua rattlesnake

Lisa Faust, Ph.D. Lincoln Park Zoo

Penny Felski, Herpetology Manager, served as a team leader in the field study survey of Massasaugua rattlesnakes in their natural habitat. The yearly study aids in the conservation of wild populations. Surveyors collect data on survey methods, search efforts, basic site information, and weather information. 2016 was the eighth year in the ongoing mark/recapture effort in Michigan. Every snake is processed for general health assessment, and samples are collected for future research needs. Environmental, spatial, and habitat assessment data are also collected for each capture or sighting. Penny also serves on the eastern massasauga rattlesnake's SSP Research Committee.

Japanese macaque

Katie Cronin Lincoln Park Zoo

Surveys submitted to investigate aggression among various macaques by documenting incidence of intraspecies wounds and wounding events.

Gembsok

The Gemsbok SSP

The Gemsbok SSP requested blood and tissue samples for DNA work to refine estimates of kinships among individuals, which will allow the SSP to make improved breeding recommendations for this species.

Giant Anteater

Matt Hallett University of Florida

This PhD candidate is studying giant anteaters in the field using camera traps. The researcher was testing a software pacakge that may identify individual anteaters by their unique patterns. Photographs were supplied for validation purposes.

Maned wolf

Nucharin Songsasen Marieke Kester Smithsonian Conservation Biology Institute

This research aims to better understand the role of urinary compounds that act as semiochemicals to regulate reproduction in maned wolves and to then utilize this information to develop a non-invasive method of inducing estrus in singleton females.

Laruen Henson Nucharin Songsasen Smithsonian Conservation Biology Institute

Captive maned wolves are highly susceptible to gastrointestinal disorders, specifically inflammatory bowel disease. This project is investigating the genetic basis for IBD in maned wolves using methods developed in domestic dogs to extract, amplify, and sequence specific genes in hopes of investigating the potential diagnostic value.

Polar bear

Alexandra Switzer, DVM Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Gardens

This study aims to describe patterns of microbial diversity in the digestive tracts of a range of captive mammalian species to better understand how environmental and genetic factors affect these indigenous bacterial communities.

Erin Curry, Ph.D. Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Gardens

This ongoing project seeks to monitor sexual maturation in polar bears via non-invasive fecal analyses.













RESEARCH PROJECTS SUPPORTED IN 2016 CONTO

Snow Leopard

Tricia Gunther Columbia University

This Masters student is studying the potential impact of individual animal personality on reproductive success of snow leopards. Personality data was gathered via surveys of keepers working with snow leopards.

Vampire Bat

Sydney Chertoff Susan Margulis, Ph.D. Canisius College

Common vampire bats have become increasingly popular as zoo exhibit animals. However, little is known about the impact that the zoo environment may have on their behavior. The goal of this project is to determine the possible effect of feeding locations on bat activity budgets. This study is a continuation of previous work on the effect of visitor density and noise on bat behavior.

Western Lowland Gorilla

Elijah Musik Susan Margulis, PhD Canisius College

Students attempted to develop a gorilla personality assessment using a survey of keepers' responses.

Susan Margulis, Ph.D. Canisius College

Continuation of a project initiated in 2012 to evaluate how different contraceptives influence hormonal patterns and estrous behavior.

Mallory Abel Susan Margulis, Ph.D. Canisius College

While some studies have identified zoo visitors as a potentially enriching stimulus for primates, other studies have found no effect, and still others suggest that visitors may have a stressful impact on primates. This study aimed to explore these possibilities by installing a temporary visual barrier (in the form of camo mesh) over the exterior of one of the viewing windows at the Zoo's gorilla exhibit.

AZA Ape TAG Great Ape Neuroscience Project

Agreement to provide the brain of deceased western lowland gorillas for processing where upon a standardized and consistent set of post-mortem analyses will be performed on the brains.

Dr. Hayley Murphy, Pam Dennis, DVM, PhD, DACZM; Rita McManamon, DVM; and Linda Lowenstine, DVM, PhD, DACVP AZA Ape TAG

The Great Ape Heart Project (GAHP) is the world's first effort to target cardiovascular disease in all four great ape species. Mortalities, especially in the middle age sector of the populations, has been on the increase. EKG and echocardiogram results are provided to the study as well as husbandry and nutrition data.

Various Felids

Frank Mendel University of Buffalo

A visual study of various felid species at the Buffalo Zoo to investigate the hypothesized role of lip "dam" structures in regulating body temperature.







Various Primates

Natalie Laudicina and Jeremy DeSilva, Ph.D. Boston University

In studying birth, neonatal brain size is an important factor to consider, as head size can complicate birth in humans and in small-bodied monkeys. Although there are over 300 species of primates, the database for neonatal brain size is severely limited. This project seeks to produce a more thorough database of neonatal brain size in primates to be made available to all researchers who would find the information useful.

Various Species

Pinaki Sarder University of Buffalo

Samples collected for the automatic classification of species using their red blood cell images captured via differential interference contrast microscopy.

Robert Ossiboff, DVM, PhD, DACVP John Parker, BVMS, PhD Cornell University

To improve diagnostic capabilities in wild and captive exotic species, researchers plan to develop a diagnostic pipeline for the rapid identification of causative agents of infectious disease by developing immortal tissue culture cell lines of non-traditional species.

Christy Hoffman, Ph.D. Canisius College

Continuation of an ongoing class project to compare the attention paid to simple and complex visual stimuli across various species.

Caroline Funk, Ph.D. University at Buffalo

The remains of Zoo animals, as well as their naturally shed biomaterials, are to be added to the Zooarchaeology Laboratory Osteological Reference Collection in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Buffalo.

Dr. Stephen Wallace Eastern Tennessee State University

Whole deceased animals provided for the Osteology collection of the Neogene Vertebrate Paleontology Laboratory at East Tennessee State University for preservation and study.

AZA Contraception Advisory Group Dalen Agnew, Ph.D. Michigan State University

Agreement to provide pathology samples for any animals involved in chemical contraception. Sample provision continued in 2016.

This project explored common worlds and pedagogy in the Buffalo Zoo pre-school.

Lisa Thibault Buffalo Zoo

This survey examined parent-specified barriers to family nature play.

CONSERVATION PROJECTS SUPPORTED IN 2016

Cars for Conservation Fund The "Cars for Conservation" program at the Buffalo Zoo receives \$0.25 from each parking fee collected. The funds generated are distributed to national and international conservation programs.

Financial support was provided to the following conservation organizations in 2016:

Amphibian ARK – Support to the ex situ components of the IUCN, Species Survival Commission's Amphibian Specialist Group's Amphibian Conservation Action Plan (ACAP).

Amphibian Taxon Advisory Group – Support in facilitation of amphibian conservation programs, in partnership with other AZA facilities and a variety of NGOs, Government agencies, and universities around the world.

Asia Elephant Support – Support to the care and conservation of Asian elephants in their range countries.

AZA Ape Conservation Initiative – Support to the in situ conservation of apes via research, education, and law enforcement.

AZA Conservation Grant Endowment Fund – Support to the cooperative conservation-related scientific and educational initiatives of AZA, AZA-accredited zoos and aquariums, and their collaborators.

Association of Zoo Horticulturists (AZH) – Contributions distributed by the AZH to support endangered plant conservation.

MARKETING AND DEVELOPMENT

The Marketing and Development Departments had Membership finished the year very strong with an another stellar year in 2016. January kicked off with a baby gorilla and winter media exposure. This fueled a winter Groupon promotion for admission and membership which yielded \$35,000 in gross revenues. In February, we launched a Polar Bear Days promotion which boosted attendance for that month well above that of previous years. The spring lion cubs media blitz was highly successful and our social media platform continues to grow, with more than 41,000 Facebook followers in 2016, a 52% increase from the prior year.

A wide variety of fee-based events maintained a steady stream of customers and revenue coming to the Zoo, including Wild About You, Breakfast with the Easter Bunny, Mother's Day Brunch, BuffaloveFest, Wines in the Wild, and Breakfast with Santa, Last year's Catillion, Dancing with Wolves, welcomed a record 600 guests, providing \$159,000 in net income to benefit the Zoological Society of Buffalo Foundation. The events team also provided an incredible assortment of themed activities included with Zoo admission to encourage high visitation throughout the year including Warm up with the Cold Blooded, Ape-ril, Elephantastic, Party for the Planet, Wild about Wellness, Grandparents Day, Trick or Treat weekend and the Holiday Tree Lighting.

We relaunched the Zoofari Shuttle with support from the City of Buffalo and the Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy. The shuttle ran Saturdays and Sundays throughout the summer, with Cityproduced shuttle stops along the Ring Road and Crandall Road. Unfortunately, shuttle ridership and utilization of the overflow lot at St. George's Church remains low.

Corporate Sponsorship is an important source of funds for the Zoo and sponsorship income was up 21% over the previous year. We secured ROAR Logistics as a sponsor of the Big Cats exhibit, Inspire Dental Group for the Gorilla exhibit, and justablandeinbuffalo.com for the Maned Wolf exhibit. We retained Tops Friendly Market as the sponsor of Arctic Edge, Wegmans for the playground, 2Find Your Home for Otter Creek, GEICO for the Reptile House, NOCO for Sea Lion Cove, Rainforest Café for the Elephant House, Ehrlich for the Hyena exhibit, TC Technologies for Snow Leopard, Anthony Leone CPA for lemur, and Rhino Linings of Buffalo for the rhino yard. Event and Activity Sponsors included Galbani Cheese, Try It Distributing, Dunkin Donuts, WNY Immediate Care, METRO PCS, Treehouse Toy Store, and Soccer Shots. Perry's Ice Cream, Coca-Cola, and Sahlen's were also retained as our official ice cream, beverage, and hot dog providers.

increased number of gift memberships for the holidays. That coupled with a highly successful Cyber Monday promotion led to a 13% growth in Membership Income for 2016. The Adopt an Animal program enjoyed another successful year with our Valentine's Day, Spooky Species, and holiday ornament promotions. Our Buy the Animals Lunch campaign in July brought in \$7,000 for the program as well. The 4th Annual Zumbathon was held in June to raise a record-breaking \$5,720 in support of our snow leopard.

TOPS Shop for the Animals in August brought in a great variety of enrichment items for our collection. Thank you to the Women's Board for their assistance, as well as for the many successful fundraising activities they conducted last year including the Women's Board Calendar, auction baskets for Wines in the Wild and the annual Holiday Luncheon. We would also like to recognize and thank the ProZoo Board for their support of Arctic White Out and Wines in the Wild last year.

Our Annual Donor Recognition Reception took place on September 15th with more than 300 guests enjoying a special evening at the Zoo. Activities included a lion keeper talk, a gorilla feeding, and a sneak peak at our plans for the new Amphibian & Reptile Center (A.R.C.). The Capital Campaign for the aforementioned project made great gains in 2016, with the help of campaign Officer Ted Pietrzak. Over \$750,000 in new donations and pledges came in last year, including \$20,224 from our Labor Day event and \$21,000 from our SSSSundays promotion, where 50% of Sunday admission revenues went to the ARC campaign during the fall months.

The Buffalo Zoo also partnered with KMSSA, our gift shop vendor, for a program to support Children's Hospital. 


